

Opportunities for all Equity Pathways to an Australia Award Scholarship

Background

The Equity Pathways Program provides support to qualifying Cambodians to help them meet certain Australia Awards Scholarships eligibility requirements.



The purpose of the Equity Pathways
Program (EPP) is to improve social inclusion
outcomes in relation to Australia Awards
Scholarships so that Australia Awards
Cambodia (AAC) effectively progresses the
equity, equality, and social inclusion goals of
the Australian Aid program.

The Equity Target Groups (ETGs)

The EPP focusses on Equity Target Groups (ETGs) – sub-groups in Cambodian society who have typically experienced the effects of social, educational, and structural barriers and disadvantage which has effectively limited their access to opportunity, including access to scholarships.

Equity support is offered on the basis that past disadvantage has limited opportunity and adversely affected the ability of individuals in these groups to complete on an equal basis, alongside their peers. In this way, equity support offers 'catch up' opportunities with the aim of enabling individuals from ETGs to successfully compete in merit-based processes.

The EPP therefore has the following goal:

To support the achievement of social inclusion outcomes in Australia Awards
Cambodia by increasing the capacity of high quality, current and future applicants who are members of Equity Target Groups, to meet English language and eligibility standards and successfully compete in a merit-based selection process.

Australia Awards Cambodia (AAC) recognises five Equity Target Groups:

- 1. Women
- 2. People with disability
- 3. Men who live and work in the provincial areas of Cambodia
- 4. Indigenous and Ethnic minorities
- 5. Other Marginalised groups such as LGBTQIA+

Eligibility criteria

To qualify for support applicants must be assessed as being eligible and qualified to apply for or have the potential to become eligible to apply for, an Australia Awards Scholarship. Therefore, applicants **MUST:**

- 1. Be a citizen of Cambodia (only)
- 2. Be a resident of Cambodia for a period of 24 months prior to application to join EPP
- 3. Possess a bachelor's degree considered equivalent to an Australian bachelor's degree.
- 4. Have at least 24 months full-time (or part-time equivalent) work experience (this doesn't apply to applicants for a workplace internship. At AAC, Internship Program is available to prospective Australia Awards Scholarships with disability who do not meet the minimum 24 months work experience requirement. It facilitates a placement of up to 24 months in high quality paid professional employment in an inclusive and predominantly English language host organisations)
- 5. Be proposing to apply for an Australia Award Scholarship in the future.
- 6. Be competent at an intermediate level in English (if applying for English language training support). An English Language Test will be provided.


Entry into the EPP requires that applicants have a basic minimum level of English language competence.

Online Self-Assessment Eligibility Check

You will receive a link to complete the EPP application and your CV if you self-assess as eligible! You can complete and click submit/done!

Application Review and Select

Your application and CV will be reviewed. Only selected candidates will be contacted.

1-4 weeks



Placement

If your application is selected, you will be invited to take an English Placement Test.

- Require score of 9A or higher to progress
- The Placement test fee will be covered

1-2 weeks



IELTS Test (if pass Placement Test)

You will be invited to sit an IELTS test.

Required score to proceed:

- Overall band: 5.5 with no sub band less than 5 (for candidates without disabilities, Not indigenous or ethnic minorities)
- Overall band 5.0 with no sub band less than 4.5 (for people with disabilities, indigenous and ethnic minorities)
- IELTS test fee will be covered by the program

1-3 weeks 3.5 month (for severe cases or vision disability candidates)



Successful Candidates

Accepted to the EPP

- Study English (ELT) up to 3 terms
- IELTS Test at the end of the last term

English Bands are required:

• Overall ban: 6.0 with no sub band less than 5.5

EPP will cover & Contribute:

- Diploma Course Fee & IELTS test fee
- Transportation Fee
- Accommodation Fee and Food Allowance (provincial based candidates travel to PP)

3 terms (approx. 9-10 months)

- Mid-check up with EPIC
- Join sharing session (min 2 times/ year)
- Connected to AAS Alumni
- Join EPP professional Development Workshops
- EPP Farewell Event
